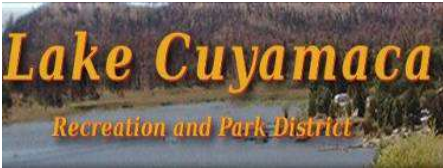
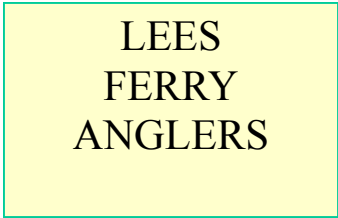

2016 IFFF Southwest Council Fly Tying Competition

The IFFF Southwest Council will conduct their 5th annual Fly Fishing Faire in Bishop CA from October 14 through October 16, 2016. The results of the inaugural Southwest Council fly tying contest hosted by the Carson Fly Fishing Club will be displayed in the main exhibition building.

All members of the IFFF SWC clubs are invited to participate. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the top three tiers for each of the twenty six categories.

An entrant must be a current member of an IFFF SWC club.

There are three divisions: **Advanced, Intermediate and Youth (17 years and younger)**

There are ten fly tying categories in both the advanced and intermediate divisions. Participants may enter a maximum of four categories.

- 1) Dry Fly 2) Streamer
- 3) Nymph 4) Midge

- 5) Attractor 6) Hair
- 7) Terrestrial 8) Bass
- 9) Saltwater 10) Realistic

There are six categories in the youth division.

- 1) Dry Fly 2) Streamer
- 3) Nymph 4) Attractor
- 5) Terrestrial 6) Midge

Participants may enter a maximum of four categories.

Some categories have required flies and/or additional requirements, all have mandatory hook sizes. Those requirements are noted directly under the fly category on each of the division entry forms.

At the conclusion of the fair all flies entered will be offered in the fundraising portion of the Faire Banquet on Saturday evening October 15th. The flies will be offered as a raffle prize, or offered at the live auction.

Participants may enter the division(s) of their choice with no more than four categories selected. Only one fly per category. The entry fee is ten dollars per participant, regardless of the number of categories entered (no more than four). The entry fee will cover themcosts of awards, postage, and printing.

Checks must be made out to: **Carson Fly Fishing Club** (please do not abbreviate).

The deadline for entries is Thursday, September 15th. Entries postmarked after the 15th will not be judged, but will be considered donations for this benefit. All late entry fee checks will be returned to entrant.

Judging: Two Reno area professional fly fishing guides and fly tiers will determine the winning entries prior to the Faire. Flies will be judged for proportions and demonstrated control of the materials and techniques required to produce an effective and durable fly.

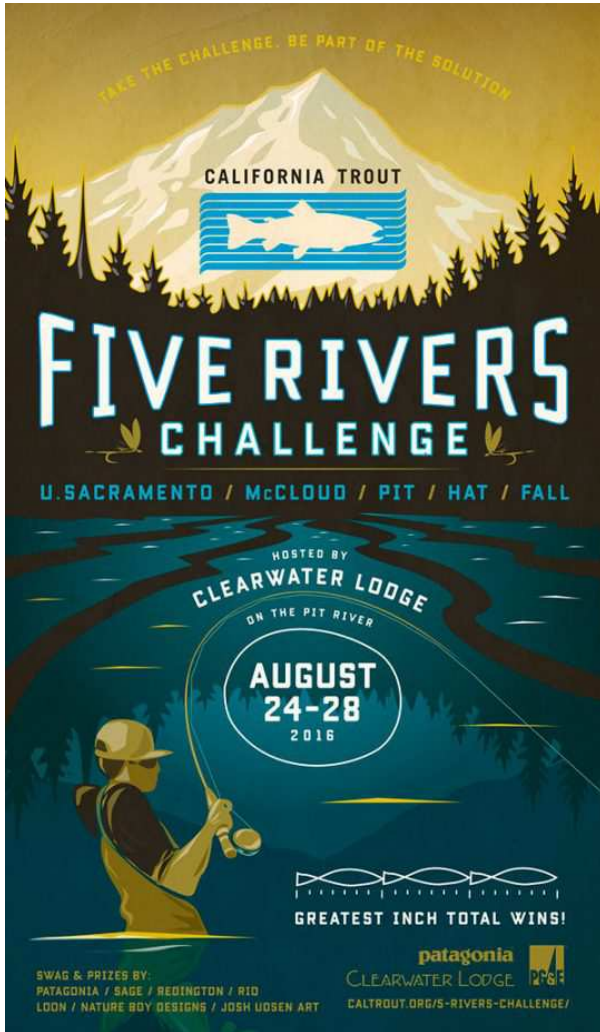
Visitors to the Faire will be able to view the award-winning flies mounted in a display case at the fly tying demonstration area in the main exhibit building.

Awards will be available during the Faire at the IFFF tying table. Awards not picked up on site will be mailed to all winning tiers after the Faire's conclusion.

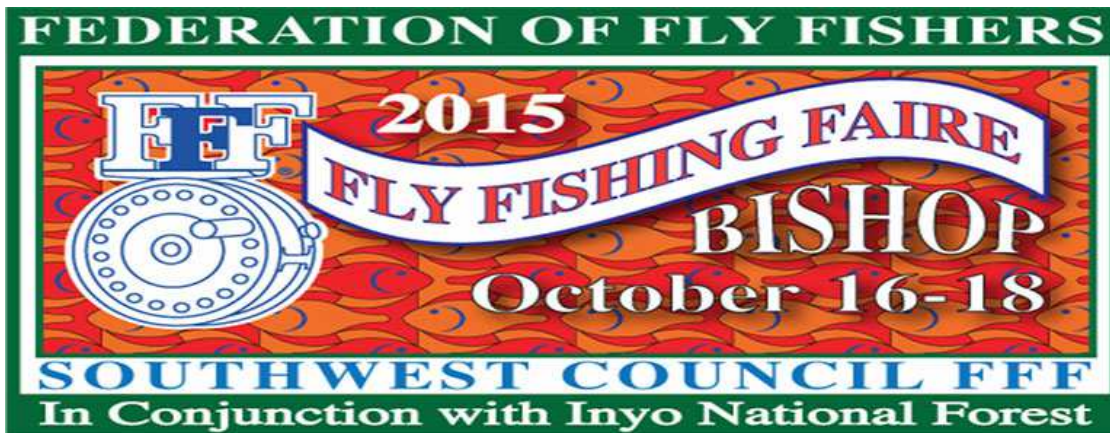
awarded in each category.

Eastern Sierra Report from Tom Loe of Sierra Drifters

Crowley Lake 6/15/16

The bite has become sporadic with slow fishing while still water nymphing at times. If you get a few and the bite dies, relocate. Locating a weed free, mud bottom is crucial this time of year. Hilton has some nice browns. The north end is a good call off Six Bays and N. Landing in 15-17 feet. Sandy Pt. has concentrations in 14-20 feet. Look for concentrations of fish in transitional areas of the lake during periods like this. Trout will migrate where deep water butts up against submerged points; or drop-offs. Hilton Bay, Alligator Pt., Sandy Pt., & Six Bays have the dynamics that will gravitate trout to these areas. Aquatic weeds are now present in 14 feet in some areas, & this trend will intensify as the days lengthen. Locating mud & clay bottom is key to consistent fishing. 14-20 feet will be the norm until the lake begins turning over & the fish move towards the inlets and channel up. Rig up using gillies, broken back gillies, or crystal midge pupa patterns for your upper flies on a tandem rig. Midge larva patterns such as crystal tiger and zebra midges fished less than a foot off the mud will get your "Under-Cator" to plunge. Take advantage of the chop caused by wind, & tie on an articulated pattern like a broken back tiger/zebra midge. The up and down motion of your indicator animates the flies below, and makes them look more realistic. Grabs can be more aggressive using flies that wiggle. The lake continues to drop slowly; but remains at a good level for this time of year.

Upper Owens River 6/15/16

Water conditions remain good here, with a small flow increase recently. The spring run of cutthroat is over. Fish will be planted around the campground for the summer. The section downstream from the Benton Bridge all the way to Crowley Lake is now open. Special regs remain in place above the bridge. As summer rolls on look for the smaller resident fish, and those that will get planted to provide action along the UO. Small dark spring caddis, & micro midges are triggering feeding activity from

the resident trout on the warmer days. Attractor patterns will get you looks from what is left of the bigs. SJ worms, crystal Vanderleeches, crystal soft eggs, Assassins, and Agent Orange patterns have got us into them while nymphing below an Under-cator. Size 16/18 adult Blue Winged Olive patterns, & small parachute midges will replicate the hatches. Flashback pheasant tails, & Assassins are spot on replicas for the nymph stage of this cold water mayfly. Use #18-22 gillies, crystal chironomid pupa, broken back midges, crystal tiger, & zebra midges for nymphs that imitate midge larva or emergers. Caddis larva are present on the stream bed pumice rocks now. Olive crystal caddis imitations can be a good call for the resident fish grubbing the bottom during warmer periods. Parachute adult midges will get you looks when the fish are feeding on the "clusters" late afternoons. I have seen a good number of trout fry along the banks, and in the slack water. Small Punk Perch, & crystal leeches fished below an Under-Cator can get some nice bows to hit these "strymph" patterns as they hunt for the tiny meals.

Middle Owens River 6/15/16

Conditions have improved as the flows have backed off to 200cfs. We have been having good success using streamers with sinking tip lines, & the "dip & strip" method. Ephemerella, commonly called Pale morning/evening duns the new mayfly kid on the block. You may also see some super sized mayflies called brown drakes. The nymphs are huge, & large Assassins, or FP PT's will suffice for their profiles. This is caddis time on the MO. Have some #14/16 high-vis, or natural elk caddis imitations handy when it gets warm. The wild trout really focus on this cycle, and fly fishers who consistently get into double digit numbers in the wild trout section have BWO/PMD adult profiles in the #16/18 range, with nymphs like Assassins, flashback pheasant tails, & birds nest patterns for the periods before, & after the hatch. Small crystal olive caddis larva patterns, #20/22 gillies or crystal midge pupa/emergers imitations, & #18 broken back

tiger or zebra midges are good calls for bottom bouncing. Have some parachute midge adult profiles if the fish get uppity, the fish will look for midge clusters if the caddis or May's don't come off. Streamer fishing is a good call for higher water levels found in the summer. Predatory fish take advantage of small baitfish that get washed into the stronger currents as they seek refuge in slower pools. Streamers are also a higher visibility pattern, & stand out amongst the debris that is associated with rising water levels. Drift boat trips have been fair/good with numbers of planted rainbows, and a few wild browns in the counts. Guided drift boat trips are a great way to get into secluded sections of the river, & fish the higher water levels. We fish streamers, casting sinking tip lines with a unique, user friendly method called the "dip & strip". I strongly suggest this program for novices, and those wishing to learn how to fish streamers. Hot flies this week are smaller Punk Perch & Loebergs.

McGee Creek 6/15/16

Snow melt has the creek running high. The cutthroat run has ended after a great spring. Some planters can be found near the gauging station hole.

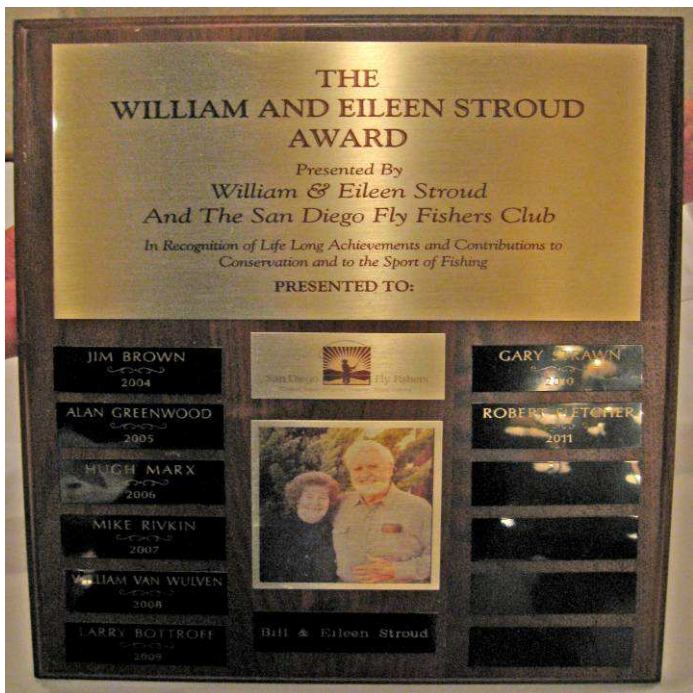

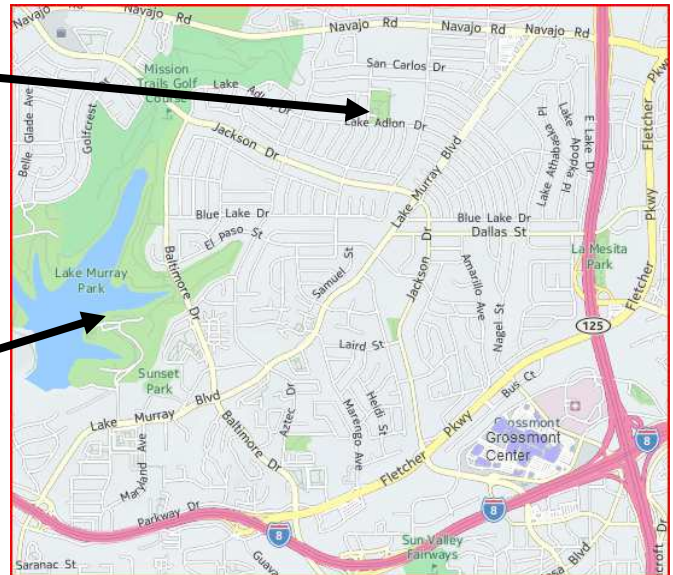

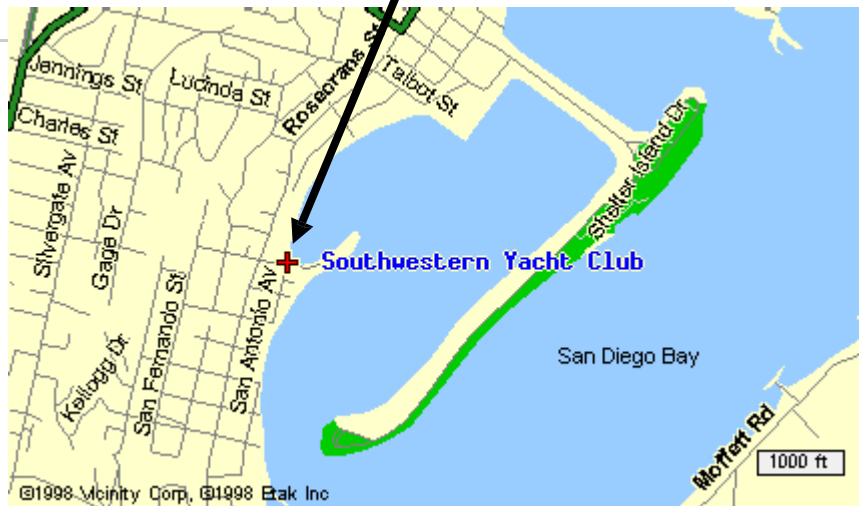
